Sandy gave me some cookbooks to help me with my Alpha Gal condition that I contracted from a tick a few years ago, preventing me from eating meat or anything with animal protein. As I remember, she was at the club picnic held at my house in Taft, TN last year and the year prior, always arriving early to help make sure things were setup. I believe it was early this year that she became ill, had surgeries, and was unable to make the long trip from Florence to attend our meetings. We will all sorely miss Sandy at all of our meetings and events. Sandy's memorial service is scheduled for Saturday, July 13th at 11:00. The hot temperatures outside have been really brutal! I finally found some time to do some minor tower work, but still have more work to do on some of my antennas to get them back in shape for the upcoming Fall/Winter DX season. I finally inserted the lower section of Rohn 45 onto the concrete pad that I poured last year before the club picnic in late-September. The overbearing heat has prevented me from doing any more with that tower. I was able to sort out the antennas received from the estate of K4ADK that are for sale and laid the partially assembled complete antenna booms and elements on my farm wagon and took a picture that I sent to the NADXC members recently. I am hoping someone will make an offer on the Cushcraft Big Thunder X7 (7-el Yagi 10m, 15m, 20m), Mosely TA-34 (10m, 15m, 20m) with add-on 40m element, Cushcraft D40 Rotary Dipole (40m), and another unknown vertical antenna, so I can clean off my farm wagon.

As DXers and contesters, I trust every member was able to support Field Day for a club near you in late June. I was able to be a part of the Lincoln County Amateur Radio Association in Fayetteville, TN. Mark Brown, N4BCD helped me to setup a telescoping mast and tilt it up with a tilt-plate that my son, Zak, fabricated and welded from a similar design owned by another ham operator, but with some improvements. ened dipole antenna was up about 36 feet. As we all know, Logbook of the World, LOTW, has been down (off-line) due to a cyberattack. My recent research & checking on the ARRL web page has not indicated when LOTW will be back online. I have many OSOs to upload for DXCC band credit, especially QSOs from the recent Glorioso Island (FT4GL) DXpedition. As I write this article, LOTW is still down, but I am glad the ARRL is taking time to make sure this application will be secure for future use but wish they could get it online soon. In the past, I would often log into LOTW to upload QSOs, peruse the DXCC countries worked and DXCC countries needed, as well as checking grid squares worked and needed. I cannot wait for the ARRL to get LOTW back online sooner than later. With LOTW off-line, I never realized how much I depend on this fine asset, and I am sure you feel the same way.

I hope to see every NADXC member in person at our meeting on July 9th. We welcome our new Secretary-Treasurer Bob DePierre, K8KI in his new role and thank him for filling in this important club officer position for which he was elected last month. We will be finalizing more about the banquet occurring in August in conjunction with the Huntsville Hamfest at this meeting. We will also discuss manning the DX Table for the hamfest. We will review DX worked this past month by our members. We may need to discuss funding for the upcoming Rotuma Island DXpedition (3D2Z) with a couple of team members (6 total) being ham youth and being mentored by the primary operators. This DXpedition occurs in November. We will also discuss miscellaneous other old & new business. Our program will be presented by Adrian Ciuperca, KO8SCA, discussing the Swains Island (W8S) DXpedition. Let's all support Adrian following the business portion of our meeting. 

Club Business and Announcements

June 2024 Meeting Minutes by Fred Kepner, K3FRK

June 11th, 2024 — The meeting was called to order at 6:30 P.M. by President Bruce Smith, AC4G.

Attendance: AC4G, AG4W, AK4PR, K3FRK, K4CNY, K8KI, KF4BOG, KG4TEI, KI4KWR, KM4ESU, KQ4VT, N4BCD, N4JR, N4KH, N4NM, N5DF, NK3V, NN4NT, W5WQQ, and WA4HR.

- No new member applications were received.
- There are currently 56 or 58 paid members (Publisher's note: 62 as of 6/29/2024).
- Banquet social time will begin at 5:30pm and dinner will begin at 6:30pm. Tickets are being sold on the NADXC website.
- Steve, KI4KWR talked about W4DXCC. It will be held in HSV the week of Hamfest and is moving to HSV permanently. W4DXCC is geared towards DX and contesting interests. Go to <u>W4DXCC.com</u> to sign up. The website will be updated periodically. The activities will be in the Signals Museum this year and at the VBC next year. There will be numerous presentations. The cost is \$35 and there will be various prizes. Steve and XYL Jessica are taking W4DXCC over long term.
- Bob, K8KI talked about his experience at Dayton Hamvention, which he attended with Steve, AG4W and Michael, KF4BOG. Bob went to the ARRL donor dinner and the FLEX dinner. Bob shared info about the upcoming FLEX radio line and a new SPE amplifier with 2 transformers and capable of 2K+ watts. Bob also attended the contest dinner. Weather on Friday was rainy but Saturday and Sunday were beautiful. The group stayed at a convenient and very nice Airbnb instead of a hotel.

- Mark, N4BCD attended Dayton to promote the Huntsville Hamfest. Mark thought Dayton was well organized and ran smoothly. He stated that the crowd was large. He also attended the ARRL Award banquet and reported that Bob, K8KI was recognized by the ARRL at the banquet. Mark noted that Ward Silver's band played at the banquet. Mark observed that POTA sales appeared to be very brisk across the board and reported that there may be additional POTA vendors at Huntsville Hamfest this year.
- Steve, KI4KWR reported very brisk sales for Gigaparts at Dayton, selling out of many of the items they took. Steve reported that the owner of CQ Magazine passed away in April and was recognized at the event.
- Dayton attendees discussed a new Icom radio that was "shown" at Dayton. Attendees had to guess what it was from a shadow pic. Several theories on what it will be were discussed at the meeting but Icom has not revealed the specs or details.
- Steve, KI4KWR reported on INDEXA activities and talked about the Peter I DXpedition, which is expected to cost \$2.5M.
- Steve, AG4W stated that he turned down going to Burkina Faso with the Mediterranean DX Club due to security/safety concerns. Steve has been invited to participate in 2 other DXpeditions, to Nigeria and Rotuma.
- Bruce read through the DX worked by members in attendance.
- Bruce stated that the LongPath needs more

articles and asked folks to please consider writing an article on ANYTHING they enjoy about radio.

- May's minutes were approved by a unanimous vote.
- Bruce gave a brief overview of the finances.
- The opening for Treasurer/Secretary was discussed, as well as the responsibilities. Barry, WA4HR nominated Bob, K8KI. The members in attendance elected Bob to the position unanimously. Bruce and club members thanked Barry for his work supporting the club.
- **BANQUET VOLUNTEERS ARE NEEDED** 1) The website needs to be updated with date, time, and highly visible info to make it easier to buy tickets and understand what's going on. Fred, K3FRK volunteered. 2) Help is needed to solicit vendors for prize donations. Barry, WA4HR volunteered. 3) One or two people ARE STILL NEEDED to work the door, welcome, take meal tickets, and sell extra raffle tickets. 4) Setup needs are minimal as W4DXCC will set the tables up for our banquet. 5) Bob, K8KI will coordinate other setup tasks but needs volunteers. 6) Steve, KI4KWR will oversee the A/V for the NADXC Banquet. 7) Bob, K8KI will purchase the beer and wine. 8) Steve, AG4W will ask vendors for donations but needs volunteer assistants. 9) Volunteers are needed to help draw and distribute prizes at the banquet. Rob, NN4NT and Fred, K3FRK volunteered to assist.
- Hamfest booth volunteers are needed to: 1) make photo albums or displays and put up the club sign. 2) Talk to people about the club.

3) Take the cards and applications for Steve, AG4W and Fred, K3FRK on Sat AM. Jim, NK3V volunteered to assist with cards. 4) Man the booth on Sunday. 5) Man a flea market table where we sell donated gear to raise funds for the club.

- The sale of additional raffle tickets at the banquet was discussed as well as the price of the raffle tickets. It was decided that attendees can buy up to 2 additional tickets for \$5 each. Barry, WA4HR will work the door and sell tickets.
- The club needs to pay for our Huntsville Hamfest sales table, which is \$45. The payment was approved by vote and will be submitted by Barry, WA4HR.

The meeting adjourned at 7:34pm and was followed by Rob Sugg's (NN4NT) presentation about the Activities and facilities of the Marshall Space Flight Center Amateur Radio Club (NN4SA).




Financial Update by Bob De Pierre, K8KI

Here is the NADXC financial report for the combined months of April, May, and June. We've had a lot of action during that time. Thanks to the hard work of WA4HR, we've gotten a spike in membership dues - now totaling 62! We may not get many more, but if you are still tardy, remember, we've got your names. I'll try to get the NADXC.org webpage updated with the list of duespaid members within the week.

We have now contributed to 3 DXpeditions: Clipperton, E. Kiribati, and Bouvet. We've been going with smaller support amounts this year, and I like that. We can support more DXpeditions that way.

And I really didn't expect the surge of DX Banquet tickets over the past week. We started out very slow, but I've been getting in more every day. Actually they came right at the end of June, and the bank closed its reporting on Friday rather than on Sunday, June 30. So, there are a few that aren't in the report (since my cutoff is on June 30). I'm counting 40 tickets sold right now (all not shown on the spreadsheet). When we squeeze



really tight, the museum can hold 100 seats, so we need to sell another 60 over the next 6 weeks. That's aggressive. At the present time, more folks from outside the local area have bought tickets than members.

As you can see from the spreadsheet, there are a lot of empty spaces for banquet costs. Those will get filled in over the next 6 weeks.

North Alabama DX Club (NADXC) "Club Fact Sheet"

Who We Are: NADXC is a group of active radio amateurs with a deep compassion for working DX, contesting, and other aspects of Amateur Radio. We welcome everyone who is interested in joining our club. NADXC members are active in all facets of DX and contesting. The NADXC also donates funding for various DXpeditions all over the world. The NADXC sponsors a DX Banquet in mid-August of every year in conjunction with the Huntsville Hamfest in Huntsville, Alabama. NADXC members moderate various programs at club meetings and during the Huntsville Hamfest, covering amateur radio technical and operating topics for all to learn and enjoy. The NADXC sponsors a prestigious award at the end of year for the most deserving DXer of the Year from the NADXC club.

DX Funding Policy: The policy supports major DXpeditions that meet our requirements for financial sponsorship. Details are available on the NADXC website and in the "Longpath" newsletter.

Club History: The NADXC was organized in December 1966 by a group of 12 charter members. The original constitution was adopted and signed on December 19, 1966. The first chairman was Dan Whitsett, W4BRE (SK). In the early-1970's, the NADXC was custodian of the W4, K4 QSL Bureau which became such a huge undertaking that it eventually was passed to other larger clubs. In January of 1977, the club bought a VHF repeater for sharing DX spots and hosting a weekly net on Wednesday nights. The repeater was located on Redstone Arsenal, Weeden Mountain using the frequencies of 147.91/147.31 MHz on two meters. Today, the repeater has been relocated and utilizes the frequencies of 147.90/147.30 MHz, with a callsign of W4QB. The weekly net has been discontinued. In 1980, the club started the monthly newsletter known as the "Longpath" which currently continues to be produced every month.

Requirements for Membership: The NADXC welcomes all hams radio operators who have an interest in DXing.
